THE CREATION OF MAN & WOMAN

The LORD God said: "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a suitable partner for him."

- Genesis 2:19

In reading the first chapter of Genesis, we see the evolution of the divine love of God. We read that God created the heavens and the earth, and in an evolutionary progression spread out over six days, He created everything out of love. And found that it

was good. His crowning achievement and the last of His creations, was to create man in His own image and likeness.

In Genesis 2:19-20, we read: "So the LORD God formed out of the ground various wild animals and various birds of the air, and He brought them to the man to see what he would call them; whatever the man called each of them would be its name. The man gave names to all the cattle, all the birds of the air, and all wild animals; but none proved to be the suitable partner for the man."

We further read in Genesis 2:21-24: "So, the LORD God cast a deep sleep on the man, and while he was asleep, He took out one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. The LORD God then built up into a woman the rib that He had taken from the man. When He brought her to the man, the man said: "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called 'woman, ' for out of 'her man' this one has been taken." That is why a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and the two of them become one flesh."

Why did God create man and woman? I believe that God would not be complete until He could have a part of His own being and His life-giving spirit shared with His creation. It was in the creation of a man and a woman, who He breathed into and became living souls, that they could share in a bond of love with Him and with each other and could appreciate and be aware of the beauty of His creation and the gift of life among other blessings. Is that not love.?

Saint John, the Beloved Apostle, in his first letter, writes about this "Divine" Love:

"This is how we know that we live in Him and He in us: He has given us of His Spirit."

"And so, we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them."

"We love because He first loved us."

REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S GOSPEL

In today's Gospel, Jesus is asked about divorce. Scripture tells us that the Pharisees asked this question to entrap Jesus. There may have been several reasons of posing this question. Did they question Jesus' "orthodoxy" to the law of Moses? Did they want to set Jesus at odds against king Herod, who had divorced his wife and then married his brother's wife? Or did they want to have Jesus contradict Himself to another reference He had spoken in Matthew 19:3-9 concerning marriage and divorce and brought a charge of heresy against Him?

Divorce was already a hot topic that was debated among the various rabbinical groups. The sanctity of marriage was one of the most important aspects of Jewish life, but there was a great divide and inequality on the rights of a man versus a woman. In the days of Jesus, a man could divorce his wife for many reasons, besides adultery. It was written that even if a man found another woman fairer, or that the wife was not a good spouse or cook, all that was needed was for the man to write a writ of divorce, drawn up by a rabbi, that he could divorce his wife send her on her way. A woman was considered lesser than a man and basically had no rights as compared to her male counterpart.

Jesus replied to the Pharisees: "What did Moses command?" Read **Deuteronomy 24:1-5** which concerns marriage and divorce. Jesus was to then quote Genesis 1:27: "So God created mankind in His own image, in the image of God He created them; male and female He created them" and then in Genesis 2:24: "That is why a man leaves his father and mother and is united to his wife, and they become one flesh."

The Sacrament of Matrimony, I believe in the "brick and mortar" of society and the main pillar of its growth is in its family. Next week, we will celebrate the "Solemnity of the Christian Family, "which our Organizer, the late Bishop Francis Hodur established in 1909, as he formed the "Polish National Catholic Church

Sadly, in our society today, divorce is in many ways similar to the views of marriage in the times of Jesus. Marriages were and are dissolved for so many reasons besides adultery. Jesus reminds us that the sanctity of marriage is a bond of love blessed by God and fulfilled, between husband and wife both respecting each other and working with each other, but never "overshadowing" each other.

HOLY MOTHER OF THE ROSARY

Throughout our world, there are numerous celebrations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, the mother of Jesus, From the streets of Italy to the neighborhoods of the Philippines, Mexico, as well as in the streets of Boston, MA, and other locations, the veneration of Mary has brought peoples and communities together in prayer and devotion.

From the appearances of the Blessed Mother in Lourdes, France and Fatima in Portugal; from her appearances in Zeitun, Egypt, and Medjugorje, Bosnia, as well as the miracle experienced of "Our Lady of Guadalupe" in Mexico; all these divine appearances, and manifestations of Mary, the "Theotokos" or "Mother of God," has caused people to be strengthen in their faith/

In the various liturgies, celebrated from the early Christian Church to the present day, "solemnities and feast days," have been dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who has served as a role model especially to women and mothers.

During the month of May, many churches will celebrate a special day, usually on Wednesdays, in honor to Mary, by reciting the "Liturgy to the Blessed Mother" and will sing songs dedicated to her, as workers did, as early as the 12th Century in France. For others, they will say the "Rosary."



But what is the "Rosary?" Simply put, the "Rosary" is a Catholic devotion, consisting of meditating on the various five "sacred mysteries" of the life in Jesus. Saying the "Rosary" begins with a "rosary," a series of stringed beads. Beginning with blessing of oneself, in the name of the Holy Trinity, the recitation of the "Apostles Creed," the "Our Father," followed by three "Hail Mary's and ending with the "'Our Father." This devotion continues as one reflects upon one of the five "sacred mysteries" or "Decades" which is meditated upon and continues with the saying of ten (10) "Hail Mary's," and a "Glory be." The devotion continues until it ends as with the beginning of the devotion.

So. what is the purpose of saying the "Rosary?" I would say that saying the "Rosary" is a spiritual discipline which centers and focuses the individual through prayer, which is one of the Christian pillars of faith as outlined in Matthew 6: 5-8.

Resolutions of the XVII Eastern Diocese Synod October 5, 2024

The XVII Synod of the Eastern Diocese convened virtually on October 5, 2024. Hosted by the Holy Trinity Cathedral, the see of the Eastern Diocese on the PNCC, this Diocesan Synod was summoned under the authority of Rt. Rev Paul Sobiechowski, Bishop Ordinary of the Eastern Diocese, and attended virtually by the Most Rev Anthony Mikovsky, Prime Bishop of the PNCC.

The Synod began with a morning prayer to the Holy Spirit, which set the tone and inspirations for the proceedings of this day. Through the various reports and deliberations, we all learned of the current status of our Diocese.

Whereas, we are thankful to Bishop Sobiechowski, our senior priests - Very Rev Joseph Krusienski, Very Rev Joseph Soltysiak and Very Rev Robert Nemkovich Jr. for the planning and execution of a very successful virtual Synod.

Whereas we acknowledge the active participation of the delegates, guests, and clergy in fulfilling their discipleship role entrusted to them as members of our Holy Church and through their attendance and commitment in spreading God's word throughout our communities, our diocese and our Church.

Whereas we as delegates, have reflected upon the legacy of our faith as set forth upon us by our organizer, Bishop Francis Hodur, the clergy, and organizers of the Church.

Whereas we continue to support the endeavors of the Eastern Diocesan Mission and Evangelism Commission with the overall theme of Discipleship towards increasing the growth in our faith in Christ with monthly presentations and with renewed Spirituality among all members; in expanding community outreach programs; and enabling our responses to God's call to Sacred Vocations and service.

Whereas we acknowledge the work of the Eastern Diocesan Strategic Planning Committee which has recently merged with the Eastern Diocesan Mission and Evangelism Commission, and has worked for many years to increase the awareness of our church by enabling parishes to use more social media technologies, especially Facebook, in promoting Holy Mass and special services, as well as holding various events and fund-raising activities, and to encourage the expansion of community engagement efforts among our parishes in exemplifying our Christian discipleship to help those in need, those in transition, and those organizations striving to assist others. Whereas in 2026, the Polish National Catholic Church will convene in Manchester, N.H. for the XXVII General Synod, as well as hosting the 2026 Youth Convo at the Berea Campus in Hebron, New Hampshire.

We, therefore, seek the grace and strength from our Lord, Jesus Christ to embrace the work He has entrusted to our care; to be inspired to execute the proceedings of this Synod as we return to our parishes and to stay strong in our commitment and firm in our Catholic faith as members of the PNCC in spite of the everchanging and challenging chaos around us. With truth, work, and struggle, we shall and will continue to succeed!
