Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saving, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So, to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So, the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So, he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you treat one of your hired workers. So, he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him, 'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.""

# REFLECTIONS ON TODAY'S GOSPEL THE PRODIGAL SON

**"Prodigal"** is defined in the Marriam - Webster dictionary as "spending money or resources freely and recklessly; wastefully extravagant. "

In today's Gospel, which is found only in the Gospel of Luke, Luke records one of most important Parables of Jesus; that of the "Prodigal Son."

In this Lenten season, this parable, reminds all, of the message that John the Baptist first declared, during the Advent Season; that of "repentance."

Whoever we are, we are all sinners, as Paul later writes in his Letter to the Romans 3:23-24: "since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,"

But in the story of the "Prodigal Son," Jesus not only speaks of "repentance," but also teaches of "redemption and reconciliation." In this parable of Jesus, He tells of a story of a son, who demanded his "inheritance" from his father, and afterward squandered it all, by living and "partying" in various ways, seeking the experiences of life. In the end, after being broke and penniless, he returns to his father, having experienced life where the pigs that he fed had more than he did and in the end became repentant for his bad choices.

I believe, as we celebrate the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent, and as we approach the final days of the most holy days of the "Great Lent,". the "Prodigal Son" is most appropriate, for it speaks of one returning unto Our Father, through repentance, understanding the impact of the sacrifice of the Lord Jesus.

I believe that all of us, to various degrees, have squandered our inheritance that has been given unto us by Our Heavenly Father. When I reflect upon others who sought their wealth through greed and dishonesty, have they not become "prodigal" in their lives and in a moral sense?

So many, given the gift of life, have wasted not only money foolishly to fulfill their physical needs of living in this world, but most importantly have wasted their talents and abilities before coming to the realization of their errors, and like the parable of the "Prodigal Son," in the end, seek to return to what matters most. There is a time, through hearing the wisdom of Jesus as the Word of God, that many come to a realization that there is something more that they need, in a spiritual way. The whole premise of many religions, is one of attachment and desire, like a dog that chases it own tail, without ever capturing it. When realization comes in, as in the case of the son who came back unto his father, we find that God our Father, welcomes us back and provides the grace that has always been offered and we are reborn in the faith and our commitment to serve God. In the story of the "Prodigal Son" the other son was angry that was "passed over" and that his brother, who squandered his inheritance, was greeted with a great feast. But the father says: "My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again: he was lost and has been found." In the Gospel of Luke 15:1-7, Jesus tells the "Parable of the Lost Sheep." It is a story where a man having 100 sheep, loses one and then finds it and rejoices with his friends. Jesus then declares: "Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance."

As we near Holy Week, we are also reminded of the messages of redemption reconciliation as found in today's second reading from the Second Letter of Paul to the Corinthians:

Brothers and sisters: Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, namely, God was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.

### SPRING BAZAAR, 2025

Schedule for Making Gałąbki

<u>Tuesday, April 8, 2025. @ 9:00 AM:</u> prep cabbage; boil cabbage and trim leaves for gałąbki.

Wednesday, April 9, 2025 @ 11:00 AM: Boil rice, mix meat mixture, (beef & pork) rice, add tomato soup, tomato sauce, onion soup mix; divide mixture into 4 containers; cover with plastic wrap and store in refrigerator. Set up plates and large spoons at each worker's place. Set up roasting pans on tables in dining hall and kitchen. Line with foil/parchment paper; check outlets in kitchen and hall to see that they are working. <u>Thurs, April 10, 2025 @ 8:00 AM</u> Line Roasting pans with large cabbage leaves over the foil/parchment paper Remove large pans with meat mixture out of refrigerator and place on tables where rolling gałąbki will be done. We need to keep a count on a piece of paper for a final total. <u>Gałąbki</u> <u>Makers @ 9:00 AM:</u> Need to arrive and find a spot next to pan with meat mixture, plate, spoon, cabbage leaves and a pan to place rolled gałąbkis into pans.

Friday, April 11, 2025 @ 9:00 AM: Roasters will be on tables. Gałąbki to be packaged and set up with a small amount of tomato sauce to be added to packages before closing packages. Kathy L. will weigh all containers and prices will be set on all containers before being placed in refrigerators.
