REFLECTIONS ON TODAYS GOSPEL

One of the greatest possessions that a Christian has in the "toolbox" of their faith, is Holy Scriptures, which being the "word of God," is a sacrament in the PNCC. The other possession, I would say, is more personal; It is s one's faith,

From the "Good News" and teachings of Jesus, as found in the four Gospels, to the choosing of the first Apostles and the 72 disciples which we read about in today's Gospel, the "Body of Christ" which is the Church, has grown to over 1.3 billion through Catholicism, the Western Rite and Orthodoxy, which is the Eastern Rite, as well as the various Protestant Churches, and others, through the various teachingvarious churches, who protested against many of the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church, which is proclaimed even in their catechism

THE POWER OF GOD

"The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, 'Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of Your name.' Jesus said," Nevertheless, do not rejoice, because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

In today's Gospel according to Luke, we read that Jesus sent out seventy-two (72) of His disciples.

This means that Jesus sent out thirty-five (35) teams along with the 12 Apostles, with the message that the "Kingdom of God is at hand." It is believed that the 12 Apostles represented the twelve tribes of Israel as we found in the Old Testament.

We are reminded of the words that Jesus spoke unto the twelve (12) Apostles following His Resurrection as we read in the Gospel of John 20:21-22: "And again Jesus said to them 'Peace be with you, as the Father has sent Me, so I am sending you.' When He had said this, He breathed on them and said, 'receive the Holy Spirit.'"

In Holy Scripture, we read that Jesus gave power unto those whom He called. He gave them power over unclean spirits and the power to cure the sick.

Following the Pentecost experience, we read in Acts 12:12, 15, 16 that the Apostles "performed many signs and wonders among the people. As a result, people brought the sick into the streets and laid them on beds and mats so that at least Peter's shadow might fall on some of them as he passed by. Crowds gathered also from the towns around Jerusalem, bringing their sick and those tormented by impure spirits, and all of them were healed."

Please note that the Kingdom of God has always been at hand, and as disciples of the Lord, we are all called to go out as the "Father sent His Son, Jesus," to preach, the "Good News" to others, whether it be through our words but mostly through our actions. We read of the confession of Paul in his letter to the Galatians 2:20 who declares:

"and it is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

Paul, in his Epistle or Letter to Ephesians 6:10-18 talks about putting on the "armor of God." We read:"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in His mighty power. Put on the full armor of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. Therefore, put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand. Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place, and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace. In addition to all this, take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one. Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."

I am happy to announce that this past week, we received our new dough sheeter, along with a stainless-steel cart. Again, I wish to thank all who have given toward this new addition.



OUR PARISH OUTREACH COMMITTEE

This past Thursday, June 30th, Eric, Shirley and I will met again to move forward with our various Outreach programs. I would like to share with you some updates.

 Our Food Ministry: "Feeding the Hungry" One of our first priorities has been to provide each month, food for needy families and individuals in the Deerfield and surrounding areas. Through this ministry, it is also an opportunity for us to promote our church among new people.

Starting Saturday, July 16, we will be offering a **FREE BAG OF GROCERIES** to those in need outside the parish hall. From 10:00 am till Noon. This opportunity is open to people of all ages.

We are asking for volunteers to help package and distribute this food. Please contact Father, Eric or Shirley if you can help. We would like to set up teams who will be able to help in this most worthy ministry.

We are requesting donations of non-perishable food to help accomplish this. We have listed certain items below. We all know that each day becomes more challenging as food and gas prices go up, but if you can offer any of the following, it would be most appreciated. A box in the vestibule as well as in our Parish kitchen will be available for this purpose. Thanks in advance for your assistance.

- Pasta and Spaghetti sauce
- Mixed fruit and canned veggies
- Juice bottles and bottles of water
- Cereals (both hot and cold)
- Canned meat: chicken and tuna

We have already received several boxes of items such as Mac & Cheese, Rice-A-Roni and Noodles-A-Roni and would like to concentrate on some of the other items listed above.

Along with this ministry, we have also prepared:

- 8½" X 11" posters announcing this ministry which has and will be distributed throughout our community.
- Designed stickers which will be placed on all paper bags for our monthly food giveaways which has incorporated a picture of our church and pertinent information.
- A letter that has been prepared and has been sent out to various food banks. Other letters will be sent out to the local farms to help secure farm products of vegetables and fruits.

- Information has been shared with FCAT (Frontier Cable Access Television & Media) which will be posted on the local community bulletin board.
- Contact has been made with our local AA
 (Alcohol Anonymous) group to help spread
 the word of this ministry.

Marketing our Parish: An order has been placed with Vista Print. We have drafted and received 250 2-sided postcards advertising our church with general and contact information. Also, we have produced two different size welcoming brochures which provides information on our Parish along with contact information, a brief history of our Parish and some of our core beliefs as members of the PNCC as well as a brief history of our Parish. In addition, we have ordered and received lawn signs made to advertise our food ministry, etc.

Materials: We will be purchasing several items from the PNCC bookstore in Scranton, PA. Also, we will be handing out individual hand-held cross with stickers noting our church. These have already been donated. Also, a donation of 24 large print softcover bibles has been made which we be make available to members of our community/ These bibles will also have a pressure-sensitive sticker attached to each bible them noting our Church.

Future projects: We have also discussed other future projects such as t-shirts and other clothing items, refrigerator magnets and tote bags, to name but a few. Although there is much we can do, we are starting with those priorities that we feel will make the most impact of new people being introduced to our Parish.

We are reaching out to the members of our parish family for their help and assistance. I wish to thank Eric and Shirley for all their work to make this happen for the good and future of our Parish.

UPDATE 2025

Since 2022, our Parish has sought to expand our "Outreach Programs," While much has been done, much more needs to be addressed as we strive to be an integral part of the "One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church." Currently, we have:

- A weekly Parish bulletin and Mass Propers that is sent out via email to over 125 parishioners and friends as well as providing a weekly bulletin to those attending church services.
- A weekly taping of our Sunday Masses through the efforts of the late Chris Collins as well as the current General Manager of FCAT (Frontier Cable Access Media) Mr. Jon Boschen.
- Brochures and pamphlets which provide information on our church services as well as the principles of faith in the PNCC.
- A daily devotional "One Bread, One Body, free of charge for all parishioners and friends that can be found in our vestibule.
- Collecting personal toiletries for those in need in our communities as well as various appeals of socks and other articles of clothing for local veterans as well as school supplies for students.
- Collecting soda tabs in support for the Shiners' Children Hospital in Springfield, MA as well as collecting plastic tops for prosthetics for local veterans in need.
- Through the efforts of Sue Dibrindisi and Mary Tudryn, and others. we have a current list of activities that can be found via our Facebook and Web pages.
- Providing a meeting place for a local Alcoholics Anonymous group that averages as many as 40-50 people who meet weekly.
- Established a "Ministry" of lay readers who proclaim the "Word of God" on Sundays.
