A READING FROM PAUL TO THE HEBREWS

(Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-19)

Brothers and sisters: Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen. Because of it the ancients were well attested. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance he went out, not knowing where he was to go. By faith he sojourned in the promised land as in a foreign country, dwelling in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs of the same promise; for he was looking forward to the city with foundations, whose architect and maker is God. By faith he received power to generate, even though he was past the normal age and Sarah herself was sterile for he thought that the one who had made the promise was trustworthy. So it was that there came forth from one man, himself as good as dead, descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and as countless as the sands on the seashore. All these died in faith. They did not receive what had been promised but saw it and greeted it from afar and acknowledged themselves to be strangers and aliens on earth, for those who speak thus show that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land from which they had come, they would have had opportunity to return. But now they desire a better homeland, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them. By faith Abraham, when put to the test, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was ready to offer his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac descendants shall bear your name." He reasoned that God was able to raise even from the dead, and he received Isaac back as a symbol.

THE GOSPEL ACCORDING TO SAINT LUKE

(Luke 12:32-48)

Jesus said to His disciples: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom. Sell your belongings and give alms. Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks. Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on His arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have them recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should He come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants. Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Then Peter said, "Lord, is this parable meant for us or for everyone?" And the Lord replied, "Who, then, is the faithful and prudent

servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time? Blessed is that servant whom his master on arrival finds doing so. Truly, I say to you, the master will put the servant in charge of all his property. But if that servant says to himself, 'My master is delayed in coming,' and begins to beat the menservants and the maidservants, to eat and drink and get drunk, then that servant's master will come on an unexpected day and at an unknown hour and will punish the servant severely and assign him a place with the unfaithful. That servant who knew his master's will but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly. Much will be required of the person entrusted with much and still more will be demanded of the person entrusted with more."

ABRAHAM - A MAN OF FAITH

Abraham (father of the multitude) first named Abram (exalted father) and was one the earliest patriarch of the Old Testament. He was to become the father of the nation of Israel.

Abram and his wife Sarai first lived in the city of Ur. At age 75 (Genesis 11:28, 31) God called upon Abram to depart Haran to Canaan, with the promise that he would become the father of a great nation (Genesis 12:1-3).

Through the trials of famine and fear, Abram came to the land of Hebron (South Palestine). There he met the king of Salem and priest, Melchizedek who blessed him. Please further read:

When Abram was 86 years of age, Hagar, Sarai's handmaid, bore him a son named Ishmael (Genesis 16), who would go on to be the father of the Arab peoples. At age 99, God directed Abram to change his name to Abraham meaning "father of the multitudes" and Sarai name was changed to Sarah "princess". She was also promised by God that she would bear a son who would be named Isaac. At this time, God established a covenant with Abraham and commanded that all men be circumcised, as a sign of this covenant.

It is also around this time that God warned that the city of Sodom would be destroyed. This is where Abraham pleaded with God not to destroy the city if he could find ten (10) righteous men. In the end, the cites of Sodom a Gomorrah were destroyed. When Isaac was well grown, Abraham's faith was tested when God commanded him to sacrifice Isaac as a burnt offering (Genesis 22). It was at the last moment that the Angel of the Lord intervened, and the life of Isaac was spared.

Abraham was to name the site "The Lord Provides" and presently there is a mosque that exists on this holy place. Sarah died at the age of 127 and Abraham died following the marriage of Isaac at the age of 175 years and was laid to rest alongside Sarah.

Moslems, Jews and Christians, all hold Abraham in great honor and have referred Abraham as "Friend of God." He is also known as the "Father of the Faithful," for in him we clearly see a man who lived the life of faith and is counted by these three great religions as being "righteous."

St. Paul would write of Abraham in Romans 4:3: "What does Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as being righteous."



THE CHURCH - A PEOPLE OF FAITH

Webster defines the word "church" as a "collective body of Christians." Taken from the Greek word "eklesia" meaning "a gathering or an assembly," the word "church" simply put is a "place or a building" where Christians gather.

In the NT Book of the Acts of the Apostles, ascribed to Luke, a disciple of Paul, we read a description of an early "church." In Acts 2:44-47, we read:

"All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved."

We find in the New Testament several scriptural passages that uses the word "church." ((Romans 16:5; 1 Corinthians 16:19; Colossians 4:15; Philemon 1:2).

In the second reading for today, Paul writes in his letter to the Hebrews: "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for, and evidence of things not seen." Paul goes on to speak of the "faith" of Abraham.

For Christians around the world, faith is the belief and the assurance in the words of Jesus Christ. Through His ministry, Jesus uses the words "faith" and "belief" interchangeably.

"Be not unbelieving but believing" is what Jesus told Thomas in John 20:27. John write in his Gospel account, John 20:30-31: "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in his name." Paul would later write in Romans 10:17: "So faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ."

The disciple's faith was strengthened when they saw the miracles and healings of the Lord. Their faith was strengthened when they saw the Lord following His resurrection and again their faith was strengthened in what took place in the "upper room" at Pentecost.

Jesus tells us that all things are possible if one has faith. The very essence of "eternal life" is based on faith. Jesus speaks to Martha, concerning the death of her brother Lazarus in John 11:25-26: "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me, though he dies, yet shall he live and whoever lives and believes in Me, shall never die."

Therefore, the church is more than a building; it is a group of believers who are baptized and strengthened by the Holy Spirit. They are the ones who love and glorify God and help teach others about the saving grace that Christ offers. From the smallest child who is baptized to all its members, the Church, the Body of Christ, is opened to all people.
